**BLOOD DONOR CENTER OPERATIONS
COURSE PREREQUISITES
MASTER CRS 311-M4(DL)
PHASE 1**

Height and weight standards are IAW 600-9. 1. The course is available to MOS 91K soldiers in the Active and Reserve components and DOD civilians. Active Army SGT's (P) and above are not eligible. Active Army SGT's must either be enrolled in Phase 1 of the 91K Medical Laboratory Specialist course or have graduated from the course have less than two years time in grade and less than eight years time in service. 2. The student should attend Phase 2 within 12 months of completing Phase 1. Information presented in Phase 1 will be applied and tested in Phase 2. Waivers of this time requirement must be approved by the Course Director. The student may be enrolled in Phase 1 of the M4 course while attending the MLT course. Upon successful completion of Phase 1 of the M4 course, the student may be concurrently enrolled in Phase 2 of the M4 course during Phase 2 of the 91K course.

Open to Active Army (AA) SPC non-promotable and below, Reserve Component (RC) SGT and below, and DOD civilians. AA soldiers must currently hold PMOS 91K. Minimum time in service (TIS) remaining requirement upon completion of the course is six months for AA. TIS remaining requirement for the RC is governed by NGR 351-1 or AR 135-200. All soldiers must meet the height and weight requirements IAW AR 600-9. The minimum physical profile (PULHES) is 323222. Soldiers must have completed the basic immunohematology portion of the 91K course without academic probation, in addition to **completing correspondence courses MD0867 and MD068**. Students must attend Phase II within 12 months of completing the correspondence courses. Enlisted women who are pregnant will be processed IAW AR 635-200. Prior to the departure from home station, soldiers are required to reenlist or extend their term of enlistment in order to fulfill the TIS requirement upon completion to the course. When reporting to the AMEDDC&S for training, and it is determined that soldiers do not meet the TIS remaining requirement, they will not be accepted into the course unless the TIS requirements are fulfilled.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: DOD civilians must be assigned to an Army MEDCEN or MEDDAC, and that unit will incur all costs associated with this course.
